SUPERVISORS REPORT FOR WEEK ENDING 6-2-2013

Hello Everyone! I start out this week's report with a reminder that there are several races within our community this weekend. From the return of the Whiteface Uphill Foot Race, to bike races both Saturday and Sunday, "The Biking Capital of the Adirondacks" will live up to its name. Please look to the Towns Facebook page, website and bulletin board at the town Post Office that list temporary road closures and routes.

We recently reached out to the contractor that conducts our BTI program for our community. As many are aware, the black flies have been very intense. As it turns out, Lake Placid is experiencing the same problems with flies this year. Our contractor stated, "The mild winter didn't freeze many of the smaller streams, allowing the larvae that winter over in the streams to survive. Usually the smaller streams don't need treatment the first round. The constant high water made for unprecedented habitat. Also, to top it all off, the wind blew hard for three weeks bringing adult flies into the treatment area. Having all three weather events happen in the same year has led to unprecedented number of Black Flies in treatment areas. This is the peak for the adults so hopefully they will die off this week. We have treated the species that winters over and the second species that hatches later in the season. Beaver Brook has been treated three times. We will monitor to determine if any more treatments are needed" –Kathy Vanselow.

The Town of Wilmington spends around \$20,000 a year on BTI application. In years past, this has been a very successful program. We will continue to monitor the situation.

Awesome turn out the other night for the Wilmington E.M. Cooper Memorial Library's "Feed Your Need to Read" event at the Hungry Trout. The sense of community was alive and well as we came together to support a great cause.

Please note that the regular monthly meeting of the Wilmington Town Board for June will be Tuesday June 20th at 7pm.

We continue to collect donations for our Weekly Summer Concert Series at the Town Beach. Currently the concerts are slated for July & August. If we receive additional donations, we will look at adding an earlier concert at the end of June.

Just a heads up. There is a planned Helicopter training for the Wilmington Volunteer Fire Department on Monday June 5th at the Wilmington Ball Field in the Town Park. The ball field area will not be available to the public during the training exercise. During the course of the year, the Fire Department and Ambulance Service must use Helicopter services for Emergency transports.

The Town of Wilmington continues to seek applicants for seasonal summer staff. Positions such as Lifeguard, Beach staff and a summer youth program coordinator are being sought. For more information, please contact the town offices.
